No fixed answers here – these are open-ended reflection and discussion prompts, but here are ideal takeaways you can look for as guidance:

Scenario 1 (cheating friend):

- A correct response would involve honesty and kindness – e.g., encourage your friend to stop, and speak to a teacher if necessary. Tie to Prophet Yusuf's honesty.

Scenario 2 (sibling anger):

- Respond with "Speak kindly" or "Stay silent if you can't say something good." Use Prophet Musa's calmness or Luqman's advice on speech.

Scenario 3 (exam anxiety):

- "رَبِّ اشْرَحْ لِي صَدْرِي" (Surah Taha:25-28) – Du'a of Musa (AS) before speaking.
- Or "Hasbiyallahu la ilaha illa Huwa..." (Surah Tawbah:129)
